Supporting details = the \_\_\_\_\_ information that is needed for you to make sense of a main idea

Taking notes on main ideas and supporting details:

- Outlining
  - Shows \_\_\_\_\_ between main ideas and supporting details
  - Levels of supporting details:
    - major - explain and develop the \_\_\_\_\_; more general than minor details
    - minor - clarify the major details; more \_\_\_\_\_ than major details
  - Tips:
    - List words - tell you a list of \_\_\_\_\_ is coming
    - Addition words - signal \_\_\_\_\_ details
    - Major details are in line with each other (visually)
    - Minor details are in line with each other (visually)
- Mapping
  - Diagrams that are highly \_\_\_\_\_ outlines that use circles, boxes, or other \_\_\_\_\_ to show the relationships between main ideas and supporting details
- Summarizing
  - The \_\_\_\_\_ of a large amount of information to its most important points
  - Usually the main idea and major supporting details
  - Paragraph = 1-2 sentences
  - Article = 1 \_\_\_\_\_
  - Textbook chapter = 3 \_\_\_\_\_ of notes
